



Orientation

Ensure that you have read about using the plan in the Program Guide.

Book summary

Read the following summary to the student.

On the way to the swimming pool, Mom tells how “The Nonstop Fun Swimming Pool” got its name. The children are left wondering whether the story is true.

Introduction

Foster interest and activate the student's background knowledge. Be concise – focus on motivating and involving the student. Encourage prediction by using the text and illustrations on the cover of the book. Discuss new vocabulary and remind the student to use the glossary (when applicable). Also remind the student to ask him/herself questions before, during and after the reading.

Look through the book with the student and discuss what might be happening in the pictures. Ask the student about storytelling in their family and whether there is a member of the family who likes telling “tall tales.” Talk about how tall tales work and ask the student to notice if and when they begin to doubt that the story is true.

Conferencing

Check how well the student reads

When you are conferencing, the student reads all or part of the book to you. Then:

- praise, pause, and prompt appropriately;
- check for accuracy (by counting mistakes) and fluency;
- check for understanding by using one or more of the following methods:
 - asking the comprehension questions provided and any others that seem necessary;
 - asking the student to retell the story in their own words;
 - asking questions about and discussing aspects of the story, such as the theme, plot, main ideas, sequence and characters;
 - encouraging the student to confirm the predictions they made during the orientation.

Decide what the student does next

Next recommend that the student:

- practices some more on the same book, with or without the audio;
- completes one of the activities provided that is related to the book;
- practices with another book from the same level; or
- is assessed for promotion to the next level.

Comprehension questions

1. Why did Johnny Fun start swimming in the pool?
2. What happened when the lifeguard jumped into the pool?
3. How did Johnny Fun get his energy to swim for such a long time?
4. Which parts of this story are unlikely to be true?
5. Why do you think the pool was named after Johnny Fun?

Answers to the Comprehension questions

1. His brother didn't believe he could swim the length of the pool.
2. Every time he tried to grab him, Johnny Fun slipped away and kept on swimming.
3. Every so often he would swim backstroke, and a pool attendant squirted orange juice into his mouth. Another pool attendant tossed candy into his mouth.
4. Answers will vary.

Supporting English Language Learners

The following are suggestions for optional lessons to take with your English language learners. See the overview chart in the Program Guide for a summary of the text features of this book.

Purpose

Identifying questions and formulating responses

Introduce the concept and practice

Recognizing a variety of question forms and responding appropriately to them extends the student's understanding of a text and illustrates their level of comprehension.

Once the student is familiar with the book, read it through together, asking the student to point out the questions in the story. Discuss how the questions help to develop the storyline. Ask the student to think of other questions that the children could have asked their mother.

Look at the picture on pages 6–7 and ask the student to imagine they are one of the reporters sent to cover the story. Ask them to think of some questions that they could ask Johnny Fun and to make up answers to these questions.

As an extension activity, give the student some possible answers and see if they can formulate the appropriate questions.

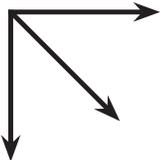
