Answer: Roads divide animals habitats making it difficult for them to search for food, migrate, or find a mate.

- What are road planners doing to reduce the numbers of animals killed on the road?

Answer: Accept any of the following: building fences; making underpasses and overpasses; educating drivers.

- What kind of fences might be effective at keeping animals off the road?

Answer: Answers will vary.

- How could slower driving reduce road kill?

Answer: Answers will vary.
